Another big game from Jadon Burgess has Harrisonburg suddenly clicking.

The 6-foot-3 junior wing scored a game-high 26 points, grabbed six rebounds and dished out four assists as the Blue Streaks won their second consecutive game with a dominating 51-26 blowout of Fort Defiance in a non-district boys basketball clash at Roger Bergey Court on Monday.

Keith Brown added eight points for HHS while Joel Alvarado had five points and seven rebounds.

Also contributing for the Blue Streaks (5-9) was Jack Haverty, who finished with four points.

For the Indians (4-8), who have suddenly lost five in a row, Tyreek Veney scored eight points.

Fort Defiance dropped its fifth straight game of the season to Harrisonburg, 51 – 28, Monday night at Harrisonburg High School. The Indians got off to a good start but had a miserable second quarter which doomed them.

The first quarter FDHS looked good. Henry Gutshall got a quick two points off a rebound. After a Harrisonburg bucket to tie the score, Henry drew a charge, something he has mastered through this season. After turnovers by Kaden Johnson and Landon Simmons, Kaden buried a three pointer. Harrisonburg pulled within one then baskets by Josh Jones and Tyreek Veney gave FDHS a 9 – 6 lead. The turnover bug hit again as Bradley Hebb and Sam Garber each had two consecutive turnovers, one of which resulted in a HHS score as the quarter ended 9 – 8 Fort’s way.

The second quarter was an absolute disaster. HHS outscored FDHS 18 – 2. The team was burdened with two more turnovers by Sam and abysmal shooting. They were 1 – 13 from the field including Tyreek who was 1 – 8 in the quarter. At the half the score was 26 – 11.

Unbelievably, the terrible shooting continued. Fort’s shooting woes went to 1 – 21 before Tyreek finally hit a three pointer. During that time, the only bright spot was that Henry took another charge before being pulled early. After Tyreek’s three, Fort then missed its next ten shots from the field, running its shooting to 1 – 31. Sam finally hit a three pointer midway through the fourth quarter but it was way too little, too late. The final was 51 – 28.

Fort’s record dropped to 4 – 8.
